



The IT team executed various projects and activities focusing on cyber security, data protection, infrastructure modernization and enhancing IT services. Nearly all laptops now have a dedicated VPN solution, facilitating secure remote access to corporate data and systems. A new backup infrastructure was designed and will be implemented in the first half of 2024.



Refining our e-Learning platform for seamless user management and sustainable course provision, with ongoing course design and development to optimize platform outcomes.

The Records and Archives Web Portal has increased its number of online resources: currently, 4.821 items are described and 2.098 documents are available online. These resources mostly include new sections of the ICCROM Archives inventory and Digital Collections, such as the General Assembly Documents from 1960 to 2019, which are accessible to users and downloadable.

The ARC digitization project (ARC Course Handouts and Course programmes 1965-83) was finalized in December. Digital images have been associated on the Digital Collection platform. After a final check, all digital documents will be available online. The in-house scanning project of the ARC study projects is ongoing.

CRM: The implementation phase is underway. We have a detailed plan for the biennium 2024-25, guiding us toward the accomplishment of our set goals. The initial project phase concentrates on migrating data from our previous databanks to the CRM, creating a new data management environment. By the end of 2023, the first batch of data was successfully migrated into a test environment.
